

- Clear Excess Leaves

- Check Your Heating System
 Regularly replace furnace filters and burner

 - Check Smoke Alarm Batteries
 A simple way to remember is to check at the start of each season.
- Keep Your Fireplace Clear of Debris
 Always have your chimney inspected each year before use.
